Staff Officer Reports

Coast Guard Support

SO-AN: William (Mac) Shepard

- Provide ATON training sessions quarterly / on request
- Contact CG ANT Teams to determine needs by EOQ1
- Report status of ATON verifications quarterly
- Contact FSO-AN's as needed to verify that all private aids to navigation that have been assigned to the division for inspection are inspected when required.
- Foster interest for members to maintain their own navigational publications in an up-to-date condition.
- Recommend to the District Aids to Navigation Officer by October 1 of each year any changes desired on chart distribution. Cooperate with other agencies on chart updating. Be familiar with the contents of the Aids to Navigation and Chart Updating Manual.

To date I have not accomplished any of these goals as the year is barely started and the weather has not been conducive for ATON patrols. I will be working in the next 6 to 8 weeks to accomplish whatever can be done during the first quarter and encouraging the Flotilla FSO ANs to also perform their necessary duties.

VCP discussed that Flotilla 16 received the award for the most ATONs last year.

SO-CM: John Clark

- Explain the FSO-CM duties to FC's and encourage appointment of that officer by the Spring Division meeting
- Coordinate DIV1 involvement with the Sector Mobile Communications exercise if conducted

It would appear that all flotillas have someone involved in communications at this time. There is one flotilla that has an FSO-CM whose name cannot be found in the roster and another that has an incorrect e-mail address in Auxdata. These problems are being addressed. It is not known at this time whether the District will have an exercise this year.

SO-MS: Bob Asztalos

- Contact CG MSO teams to determine needs by 30 MAR

On January 25th, John Gibson, FSO-MS, Flotilla 1-4, and I met with Lt Douglas Olson the MSO at USCG Station Panama City to discuss how we can best support the Gold side. His priority is to establish Pollution Response personnel in the Division, particularly those areas farthest from Panama City.

Currently, when there is a pollution report to the USCG, he must send out a person from his office to investigate the site. For St Marks or Shell Point area that is a 2 hour drive each way. He stated that for most reports, no cleanup is necessary and the only action is for nature to take its course and a report is made. Lt Olson is requesting that Auxiliarists be trained to respond to pollution reports. The Auxiliarist would make an initial assessment and report findings to Panama City. PC would then make an assessment if it needs to send out CG personnel for further action. He believes this would allow quicker response to pollution reports and would save his staff unnecessary travel and time.

Volunteers would be required to take the OSHA Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response Standard (HAZWOPER) course, which is 40 hours. The course is given at Eglin Air Force Base. After initial certification, an eight-hour refresher course is required each year. Responders would be invited to periodic MS training conducted on Fridays at the Coast Guard station PC. If there is a sufficient number interested in the training, PC would consider sending a trainer to a Flotilla(s) to conduct the initial course. His ultimate goal is to have a list of a few dedicated responders who will answer the call when inspections are necessary.

This is an excellent opportunity where we can make a significant difference augmenting the needs of the gold side.

I requested that Rich Rasmussen could help me answer the following questions:

1. Lt Olson would approve Auxiliarist to participating in the HAZWOPER training at Eglin. Would the Aux cut orders and pay for the training?

2. HAZWOPER training is given required training for firefighters and other first responders, would the Aux pay for an Auxiliarist to take training at a local site, such as a fire station?

My plan is to bring this up at the district meeting and gather a list of:

- Auxiliarists who have already received the training and are willing to participate;
- Auxiliarists who want to participate and need the training.

I will coordinate the rest with Lt Olson.

- Develop aggressive MS personal qualification program by 30 MAY with an average of 2 PQS's completed each quarter. **Currently identifying requirements and candidates to best meet the needs of the MSO.**
- Contact all Flotilla MS officers by 30 MAR. **To be completed after Division meeting.**

VCP discussed the past lack of commitment from the Gold side was due to a lack of commitment from the Auxiliary. There is now a new push to make the relationship to more beneficial to all on both sides.

SO-OP: Thomas (T.J.) Del Bello

- Follow through with a Coxswains Training Academy at USCG Station Destin. Attend and review these classes to prepare for flotilla and station contacts to expand this program. Invite FSO-OP Randy Black to assist with these meetings. Complete by 02-29-08. **Accomplished Jan. 2008**
- Contact and establish a station meeting with OIC and Flotilla commanders at Pensacola and Panama City to learn operation support needs. Explore station support to produce a Coxswain Academy with Flotillas 17,19/16 by 03-28-08. **03-28-08**
- Develop a coordinated effort to accomplish two goals within one: Have a boat crew be awarded "E" Award Status and SAREX competition readiness by 09-08. **09-08 /Step One FC Request at District Meeting FEB.2008**
- Maintain strong communications link with FSO-OPS **Completed Jan.2008**

A new FSO-OPS bang list is completed and working. USCG Station assigned liaisons are now included into the FSO-OPS Bang list to receive various training and auxiliary communications relating to operations. I have been in contact with Station Panama City OPS Boss.

Training reminders have been sent to Division One FSO-OPS, regarding the non-mandatory Operations workshop suggesting it be included as a flotilla meeting training session.

Qualification Exam Request Preparation requirements posted from Bob Burton DSO-OPS have been sent to the FSO-OPS.

A meeting is completed with Mr. Busch BOSN 4, relating to expansion of the coxswain training academy at Panama City CG Station.

Starting with this Division meeting I am requesting each Flotilla Commander with an active operational program to gain one facility and crew commitment to reach for the "E" Award this Summer. This program is a top loaded leadership and motivation-training program. Training works best when USCG Station support is involved. Crews once qualified are recognized to be at the top of their crew training and mission capability. Station personnel recognition and confidence is generally higher and these crews can compete in SAR competitions. Now is the time for commitment and training to commence. Once the facility and crew is selected please notify me of the facility number and Coxswain name and member number, with a copy to VCP.

Each of our COAs will be undergoing change in the coming months. This may lead to some work on our part with a re-establishment of our relationships.

Also discussed is the participation in the SAREX competition. Each flotilla was asked to put together a team that can begin preparing for this type of competition.

VCP reminded that at our last meeting several flotillas committed to recreating the training that was presented at the meeting. All were encouraged to continue efforts to take the skills to the individual flotillas.

QEC: Thomas (T.J.) Del Bello

- Determine QE needs for training and motivation and hold a QE Working Meeting to review and re-focus for the new year.
- Incorporate FSO-OPS into communications so that they are aware of training needs for qualification prep.

AQEC's report to Gary Schroeder CQEC and DIRAUX through the OTO. The AQEC function is to coordinate Qualification Missions, orders and training activities of area QE's. The QE's are trusted to represent The U.S.C.G. DIRAUX test qualification standards for AUX. boat crews.

Division 01 FSO-OPS received a query requesting their REYR and Third Year qualification required list for this year. This query was sent 1-20-2008. The purpose for this request is to determine the Division one QE request load for 2008. It is also intended as a reminder for FSO-OPS to alert candidates to start planning early for QE request dates and to motivate early qualification requests. Last minute December request dates are risky. Our goal with Flotilla Operations, MT and VFC support is to complete qualifications through Spring and Summer months. FSO-OPS have received updated QE requirements for 2008. There are no changes from 2007.

SO-IS: John Clark

- Prepare & send to each Flotilla the Silver Oar calculator by 15 JAN
- Visit FSO-IS officers needing special training as needed.
- Provide Unit Summary Reports to the Board prior to each Division meeting
- Prepare & send to each FSO-IS a guide to entering data into AUXDATA by 30 MAR

Silver Oar calculators have been sent to each flotilla to assist flotilla leaderships in attaining 2008 goals. A few flotillas are entering data on a regular basis but others have not begun so far this year. We would ask Flotilla Commanders to request the membership to submit data on a regular basis rather than wait until year's end. Unit Summaries for each flotilla are being sent to division leadership prior to the Spring Meeting. A guide to assist in entering data is in progress but not yet complete. Flotilla IS officers have been encouraged to attend a C school if they have not been to one yet. We ask flotilla leadership to encourage attendance. All FC are encouraged to ask members to make sure their personal information is correct in AUXData. Please have members present 7029s at least monthly so that the FSO-IS is not overwhelmed at the end of the year. If the paperwork is not filed, the work did not happen and it cannot be included in the year-end summary.

SO-MA: Sanford (Stan) Smith

- Ensure that all FC's and FSO-MA's have a copy of the current (2007) ANSC catalog. Issue the 2008 catalog as soon as it is available.
- Provide FC's and FSO-MA's with web addresses for ordering/purchasing (AUXCEN, UDC. ANSC)

- Make an effort to promote correct and efficient usage of the government stamp mail system.
- Provide assistance and instruction as needed so that FSO-MA's and FC's know where and how to order materials.
- Develop an effective program to identify Flotilla needs and liaise with Sector Mobile regarding excess (DRMO / DRMS) property

Overall Goal: Ensure that all flotilla and division officers have efficient and expeditious access to needed materials.

Report: Progress being made in all areas. We are working with the local recruiting office to provide information on the Auxiliary as well as provide us with information to pass out at our events. Tim Ashley is the contact for the Tallahassee office and we are trying to get Pensacola connected with Mobile. Tim also discussed that the recruiting office is looking for an Auxiliarist to assist in their office. Anyone interested, or knows someone interested should contact Tim. Jeff reminded that the CG Support is being re-entered into the Silver Oar. Elena Rolland discussed that there is currently no place to record the CG support hours.

SO-MT: Charles (Charlie) White

- Make contact with all personnel connected with the SO-MT and establish a line of communications at all levels (National, District, Division and Flotilla). With this development a good understand of the SO-MT position will be reached by the end of 1st quarter 2008. This will develop a stronger flow of assistances of information at all levels of Member Training in the US Coast Guard Auxiliary and secure a stronger SO-MT position for any future turnover.
- Visit with each Flotilla in Division 1 by the end of August 2008 together with the SO-VE to save time and money.
- Develop charts for tracking training in progress for the current month and a training projection of the next month at the Flotilla to be use by the Flotilla Training Officer and SO-MT.
- Increase the members of overall qualifications in all of the training area by 5% by EOY 2008.
- Work with FSO-MT, FC, and VFC to establish and increase in the training session for the specialty courses by at least five courses per Flotilla with a goal of 2 members from each Flotilla reaching AUXOP by EOY 2008.

SO-PS: Stanford (Stan) Smith

- Throughout the year receive and forward recruiting contacts from national web and phone contacts
- Prepare and ship to each flotilla by 25 January a complete set (on CD) of the current (2008) requisite materials (less fingerprint cards) to process a new member, including the Recruiting 2008 package prepared by the DSO-PS.
- Ensure by January 30 that all FSO-PS and FC's know how to complete enrollment of new members and where to send the materials.
- Present a Recruiting and retention workshop in conjunction with the Division Meetings.
- Encourage FC's (and FSO's) to pursue the Auxiliary Diversity Award. (Doing so involves a number of activities which have been shown to encourage retention and participation.)
- Find someone to provide a workshop on preparation and submission of awards – nothing like an “ata boy” to improve retention.

Overall Objectives: Accomplish a net increase of two members for every flotilla. Hold loses from resignations and disenrollments to no more than 3/flotilla. Submit all successful flotillas and individuals for National recruiting awards.

Report: Membership for 2007 is up, but only by a net of 10 members. Close to fifty new members were signed up, but the usual factors, resignations, deaths, disenrollments as well as loses of some of these newest members resulted a net poor performance. Fifty-seven electronic contacts were forwarded to the flotillas and many seem to have resulted in new members. A recruiting and retention workshop was presented with Robert Nelson, DSO-PA at the fall conference. Efforts are being explored to do internet recruiting via “Volunteermatch.com”. In a unique “one time” effort distribution of free ODU uniform materials provided by Lighthouse Uniforms was completed this weekend.

Our major problem now is not recruiting it is retention! That requires a lot of personal contact and interaction with all members, but particularly new ones. New member classes and workshops, mentors, class schedules, phone calls, newsletters, etc. are all a part of the process and should be promoted and encouraged.

I have encouraged the others to do so and offered my assistance if they have difficulties. I will continue to work with the FSOs-PE to use this resource during the year.*
- Submit reports to Division leadership and DSO-PE by named deadlines. *Status: So far, so good.*

SO-VE: Paul Shurte

- Visit each Flotilla in Division 1 May 15, 2008 (dependent on cost issues)

This Objective remains on hold due to further relationship building with each of the Flotillas, however contacting the Division Flotilla VE Officers has secured some very positive results: Such as ideas to improve the area of interests to get the Flotilla members more involved.

- Coordinate or conduct Boating Safety Check workshop for 2008 with use of local information for each Flotilla, using the National Power Point Presentation for VE program (VE-PPP) made in 2007 before NSBW (by 17 May 2008).

Talking with some of the FSO-VE and FC the locations pose such a wide spectrum and variety of needs that an attack of a standard lesson plan does require a 'one-on-one' touch. I will have to follow-up with each of the contacts to see what I can do to make their jobs easy.

- Increase examinations of high-risk vessels (canoes, kayaks, etc.) by seven percent by EOY 2008.

One of the Division Flotilla has already established a successful drive to get their local high risk areas to receive the VSC however each Flotilla including ours seem to have different guidelines that seem to meet their own objectives and broaching the subject of high risk location VSC blitz or training sites does meet with resistance. As an example one Flotilla VE Team member believes they hold the office and they will do all the VSC for the Flotilla. I will have to re-think this and discover the best approach to show all the members are to be encouraged to participate in the program if possible.

- Work with SO/DSO-IS to get access to Division 01's VE Team members.

This has been completed. I have a Read Only password and have reviewed what I wanted to know.

- Develop a Marina Focus Program, in conjunction with SO-PV, to promote VSC's for long-term slip rentals by July 15, 2008

The date set for this objective seemed at first very easy however once I discussed various issues with the FSO-VE's I have discovered this will be a lot harder to reach than I believed. For now I will keep my goal (July 15) because being optimistic might be my best tool. Many of the FSO-VEs seem to have the opinion that they will be lucky if they reach the objective of maintaining currency for the present qualified members.

- Develop program to get fifty percent of the VE certified member that have been inactive to return by May 01, 2009.

I sent a request to all my certified and expired but once qualified VE Team members and I did not receive one reply. I used the return receipt for the mail and I am aware they each received the notice. I believe the only way to reach the members will be to work with each FSO-VE or FC and seek personal one-on-one with members or at least a phone call – however do not depend on the e-mail system. Two FSO-VE Officer related they will not use the computer. This objective will have to be moved back to the end of the year.

- Utilize existing kiosk drawing and materials to assist at least two kiosks erected near ramps in each Flotilla area. This ambitious deadline will be to have all areas with at least one to two kiosks by May 17, 2008.

One Flotilla reports that they love the kiosks and have established the use of them in their area. Other responses to the idea have been lukewarm or what do we need that for, we have done well without it in the past! Why introduce something that won't work and cause the Flotilla to have to find someone to maintain it? This will need more communications before I will be able to sell the idea to a few Flotillas.

- Exceed Division 1's number of VSC's by twenty-one percent from that of 2007 for 2008

To this date we remain behind. Only one VSC completed, and two Facility checks have been reported.

- Increase the number of qualified vessel examiners in each Flotilla by ten percent by end of 2008. See attachment with a list of all Flotillas.

To date each Flotilla reports a decline in each of the Flotilla's with only a few interests in developing more VE Team members. The Objective remains the same with hopes the awards systems catches one and the members look forward to contributing.

Additional Comments:

After discussing the subject of VSC for each area I discovered each FSO-VE or FC has unique problems they believe they have to overcome. One Flotilla sold the idea that they will do their best to be the most outstanding Flotilla. This Flotilla has set an objective of no less than 10 VSC for each of their quailed members. Another Flotilla with few members has attempted to exceed what they did the year before and tried again last year. That Flotilla may be small but projects the idea they will exceed the goal again with at least 200 VSC. This seems little but with only 6 VE Team Members I believe this is a great goal. The other end of the spectrum was a FSO-VE that desires to take on a great deal of the burden by doing all the VSC and is very proud of his efforts. The same FSO-VE seems willing to teach another member. This FSO-VE should be proud however growth will not take place unless additional members if not the entire Flotilla saw the reason why the program is so important.

The same report of loss of many productive members was repeated by all Flotillas and the decline in the Boating safety Program is blamed for the downslide. There is a definite need to show the Flotilla's the idea that each Officer does not have to do the entire job but to organize and delegate where possible. There is a need to explain more clearly the awards process so the VE Team Members participate better in the VCSs.

Flotilla Commander Reports

FL-12: Duane Treadon

The New Year brought a new leadership staff to Flotilla 1 2 with our Immediate Past Commander having term limited. Both FC and VFC attended the Leadership Academy held at Pensacola NAS. They brought back and implemented ideas learned from the various session put on by District and DIRAUX personnel. Some ideas were a departure from past practices and membership was asked to give change a try.

One emphasis brought back was a renewed commitment to developing a TEAM concept in the Flotilla where members work together melding their backgrounds and special skill sets in a positive productive fashion that serves to the benefit of the Flotilla and through that the Division, District, National, and Coast Guard as a whole. The term cooperative collaboration has been used to describe the desired outcome. That is to say members sharing their personnel skills with others on a project, pulling the best elements of each member's background with a net result of the best outcomes for all. As a new concept it is understandable that it will take time before a full implementation is realized.

We have appointed a Diversity Advisor with plans to implement and track diversity activities throughout the year.

Our FSO-PS has challenged each member to bring in one new member in 2008. To date we have had 5 potential new members visit during a Flotilla meeting.

We held a kick off meeting with all FSOs and encouraged them to take ownership of their program area. Each FSO submitted goals and a budget for 2008. It was explained during the meeting that the FC and VFC serve as a resource to the FSOs making sure they have what they need to accomplish their goals and objectives.

A membership survey was developed and posted on surveymonkey.com to be used as a 2008 planning tool by leadership and members. Various questions were offered sampling interest levels in various program areas, areas where our Flotilla is seen as strong, areas where we can improve, and visions for the future. There was a 63% return rate on the survey with 2 respondents submitting after the survey closing date. [With the final two respondents added unofficial return rate was 72%]

Member Services

We will offer each specialty course this year in an effort to increase the effectiveness of our members and increase the number of AUXOP members. We will also offer the new member training class that we developed last year to each new member within the first couple of months. We have already begun the Coxswain Academy and Boat Crew training offering this to not only our members but to members from other Flotillas as well. Additionally, one of our members recently became an emergency medical technician and we plan to use his expertise in teaching basic first aid and CPR to at least all of our Boat Crew.

Recreational Boating Safety

For Recreational Boating Safety we have ABC classes scheduled February through November on the 4th Saturday of each month. The classes will be held at Station Destin, which in the past has seemed to increase attendance. This year, Dallas Cochran has arranged for a "Coastie" to teach one session in each class. We feel this will be beneficial to the students as well as to the Coastie. There will be 2 classes especially for teenagers and 1 additional class for the Destin Junior Lifeguards. Bass Pro Days and Recreational Safe Boating Week will be top priority this year as well.

Operations and Marine Safety

Operations and Marine Safety will continue to be an important part of our participation. We have three members who have started the process of becoming qualified to inspect Uninspected Passenger Vessels and who will also become qualified in Marine Environmental Protection (Spills). Also, we are in the process of training our 5th Watchstander, which will enable us to take on the Watchstander responsibility Monday through Friday with hopes of adding a couple more Watchstanders to give us vacation coverage and week end coverage. We will continue to support the engineering section by maintaining the boat inventory control. A new role we will be playing this year will be working with Rescue and Survival. This entails making weekly, monthly, semi-annual and annual audits of all the Rescue and Survival Equipment to make sure the equipment is operational when needed.

Fellowship

At least once a quarter we will have a business dinner meeting which will be light on the business and heavy on fellowship and we are looking at new ways utilize this fourth cornerstone. Picnics, charity poker nights and friendly competition events are a few ideas we are evaluating.

Public Education:

It is very early in the year and we are just getting started with our PE function. Our plan is to coordinate our PE functions to team with Flotilla 1-9.

Member Training:

We are on track for meeting, and most probably exceeding, the goal we set for ourselves this year.

Public Affairs:

Commodore Cook Outstanding Auxiliarist Award: Stanford L. Smith (FL 14)

Stan is currently serving as the DSO-PS, SO-MA, SO-PS and FSO-CM. Last year he was also the FSO-MT and previously served as FC and FSO-PE. Last year Stan was selected to help with the implementation of Rescue 21 for Station Destin. He took on the responsibility of training both the Gold and Silver side watchstanders. Once Willis honed the Home page he shared his knowledge with the neighboring flotilla. He has taught the FSO-CS for the neighboring Flotilla so that Flotilla has a viable web page as useful as ours. The senior staff recognized Willis's work and offered him a National position in working on the 'Team Coast Guard' Web site. This Team CG site is maintained by Willis on a rotating schedule and often he is called on to assist in all hand stories. Willis began his educational training by completing almost all the open book exams, and once that was completed he took on the four required FEMA courses then completed an addition eleven more FEMA classes. Willis sought out and was accepted by the Director to get a waiver so he could run as the Flotilla's Vice Commander. Willis was accepted by the Flotilla and holds that position. Willis has been instrumental in organizing the Flotilla so the group could get away from Flotilla arguments and move instead to Flotilla training. He accomplished this by guiding the members of the Staff to submit reports or comments before a Staff meeting then sorting the issues and presenting them to the Flotilla Commander. This is done before the normal monthly meeting and to this date the meetings have been successful as an all hands training where the group attending want to return.
